all medical supplies & cooking gear etc.
carried on the men or relayed in cartwheels
by the various camps. Train 5 arr at destination
with 400 men, out of 600 or 6670. Remainder
was left at various camps & hospitals en
route. Some rejoined unit late. Only vital
cases allowed to be left. Numerous dysentery
& exhaustion cases had to be helped or
carried each night by bit man. No one at
steering camp. Food was one plate of rice
& watery stew of beans or white bean.

SUMMARY OF CHOLERA CASES

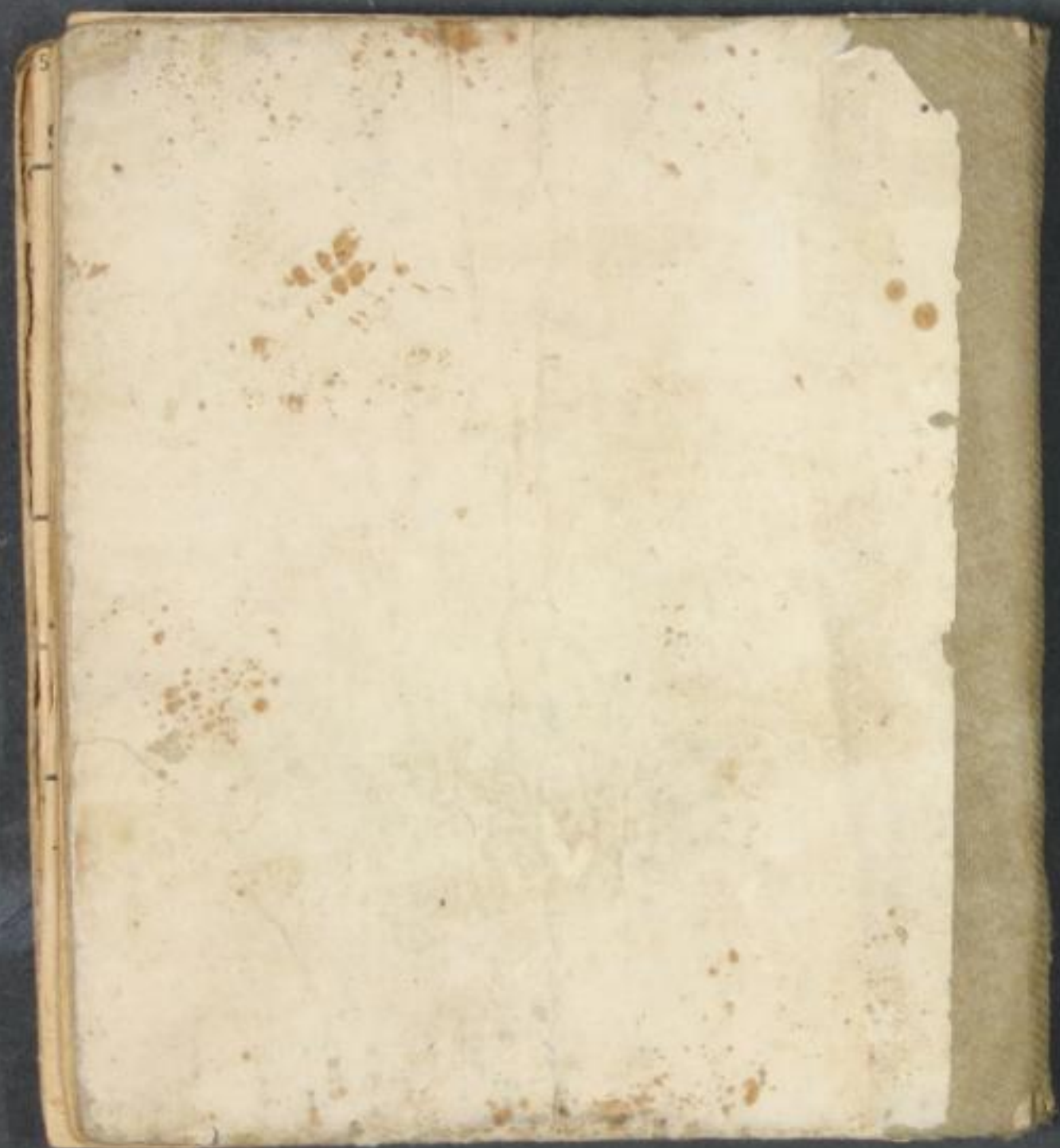


